Survey

Survey of 9 daily newspapers (Guardian, Independent, Daily Telegraph, Times, Financial Times, Daily Mirror, Daily Mail, Daily Express, Sun) and 8 Sunday newspapers (Observer, Independent on Sunday, Sunday Telegraph, Sunday Times, Sunday Mirror, Sunday Express, Mail on Sunday, News of the World) during the week of 3 December 2007.

Editors: 2 women out of 17 = 12% (Dailies: 1/9, Sundays: 1/8)

Deputy editors: 1 woman out of 17 = 6% (Dailies: 0/9, Sundays: 1/8)

Political editors: 2 women out of 16 = 12.5% (Dailies: 0/9, Sundays: 2/7)

Comment editors: 1 woman out of 10 = 10% (Dailies: 0/6, Sundays: 1/4) (but not all papers have one, and the role is not the same at all papers)

Lobby journalists (on these papers): 22 women out of 81 = 27% (Dailies: 17/64, Sundays: 5/17)

All lobby journalists

As of 6 December, 104 out of the 395 registered lobby journalists are women = 26%.

Editors of a selection of news TV and radio programmes: Male – 16 (94%) and Female - 1 (6%)

Presenters of a selection of news TV and radio programmes: Male – 19 (56%) and Female - 15 (44%)

Editors of a selection of political TV and radio programmes: Male – 7 (78%) and Female - 2 (22%)

Presenters of a selection of political TV and radio programmes: Male – 10 (62.5%) and Female - 6 (37.5%)
